Middleton Appoints Schneider, Roberts and Day to NCLM Board of Directors.

Three presidential appointees join the 2024-2025 NCLM board of directors led by President Mark-Anthony Middleton, First-Vice President Martha Sue Hall and Second-Vice President Jody McLeod.

In his president role, Middleton appointed three municipal leaders to the 2024 – 2025 NCLM board of directors.

- Chadbourn Council Member Rashad Roberts
- Knightdale Mayor Jessica Day

Council Member Ann Schneider has lived in Oak Ridge with her husband for a decade and a half and has three adult children. She is a small business owner and has recently served on the board of the North Carolina Mayor's Association.

Council member Rashad Roberts has lived in Chadbourn for over 20 years and served on Chadbourn's council from 2005-2017. He won his reelection in 2022. In 2023 he was appointed to the National League of Cities' Small Cities Council for a one-year term.

Mayor Jessica Day is a Knightdale native and has seen it grow from a small community to one of the fastest-growing cities in North Carolina. She became the first African-American female to be elected to the Knightdale Town Council in 2017, became Mayor Pro Tem in 2019, and was elected mayor in January 2021.
